

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INTRODUCTION

«Know all humankind: Amity with the world is the great blessing, Enmity the greatest curse».

Alisher Nava'i

The Great Silk Road is known for its poets. One of the most important of these is Alisher Nava'i. His numerous writings, endowments, and his life example have had lasting influence. Today, in the modern country of Uzbekistan, he is revered above all other poets. The name of Alisher Nava'i is visible throughout the country. Major streets, theatres, museums, parks, and even a province and city are namedafter him. His proverbs are on the tongues of Uzbeks, Turkmen and Tajiks. He is considered the father of the Uzbek language and one of the greatest poets of Central Asia. He wrote for peace and he spoke against oppression.

Nava'i lived from 1441 to 1501 in Herat, Afghanistan. As a child, his skill for poetry was recognized and his father made sure he received the proper training. When his foster brother Husain Baykara became the Emir, Nava'i naturally became the second most powerful person. He was a wise statesman, who advised- Baykara on many matters. Once when Baykara's son's rebelled as a prince of nearby Balkh, Nava'i paid a personal visit to persuade him otherwise. Nava'i was a good steward of his high position and helped establish many needed institutions. «Nawai

(Nava'i) is reputed to have founded, restored and endowed no fewer than 370 mosques, schools, libraries, hospitals and other pious and charitable institutions in Khurasan alone.»¹

Nava'i's greatest contribution, however, comes in the realm of the arts. Under his guidance and patronage of art and culture Herat blossomed to one of its finest periods. Nava'i himself wrote over 10,000 lines of poetry, including at least six epic poems. While he was still alive, his contemporaries considered him to be the best Eastern Turkish writer ever. This claim is still true today. «The impact of Nawai's works on all Turkic peoples and languages cannot be overestimated. He exerted a profound influence not only on later Central Asian authors who wrote in Chagatai up till the beginning of the 20th century, but also on the development of Azeri, Turkmen, Uyghur, Tatar and Ottoman Turkish literatures.»²

The life and works of Nava'i are also relevant for today's politically and spiritually rigid world. He was a Sufi who blurred the lines of what was right and wrong. Sometimes his writings imitated other popular works but with his own twist. Written around 1499, «The Language of the Birds» («Lison-utTayr») is one such writing. It is blued on Faridud-din Attar's twelfth century «The Conference of the Birds» which Nava'i read and adored as a child. Nava'i is a masterful adapter who worked at inspiring his fellow Turkish people.

«The Language of the Birds» is a story about the hard journey to Sufi enlightenment. In it we are shown that a guide is very important for the road. This is the role the Shaikhs play in Sufism. Anyone

serious about finding enlightenment must have a disciple that will point him the way. The actual steps, however, the disciples must take themselves. In the book the wise bird Hoopoe become the birds' Shaikh. As he Unions to each bird's excuse he admonishes each one with the exact anecdotes that they need to hear. These stories that Hoopoe uses so capably often come from the oral history of the Silk Road and Islam. Suffering and difficulty are the norm, while easy and relaxed lives are shown as superficial. When these birds do make it all the way to God, everyone including the reader is surprised at what they find.

Our preliminary translation and publication of «The Language of the Birds» is Alisher Nava'i's premiere for the English world. It is our hope that a Nava'i series will follow and that the Western world's understanding of Central Asia and interest in this beautiful land will grow. PREFACE

A Note on the Translation and Important Literary Terms

My co-translator Nasir Kambarov began the translation of this book. He did the first draft and then I did my own draft using his as a point of reference. When the terms or meanings were unclear I ran them by Nasir, other Uzbek experts, and sometimes checked the original Chagatai (old Uzbek). The text that we used was Sharafiddin Sharipov's 1991 prose translation, which was part of the Uzbek Literature's Flower Garden series. We have included most of his annotation. However, we did not include the prelude and epilogue, as it is quite separate from the original story. For those wanting to compare with the Uzbek version the story begins in chapter fourteen. Please email me if you would like to obtain this book.

Generally, proper nouns were transliterated based on the new Latin Uzbek alphabet. Commonly known proper nouns were translated into their English equivalents. For example, Yusef of the Old Testament was translated as Joseph. Also, when it was judged that Nava'i himself was speaking into the story double quotation marks were used («). Sometimes, however, Nava'i does speak through Hoopoe the wise bird, and as with the original, the speaker is not always marked in our text

The Turkish and Persian writings of the Middle Ages obtained a high quality of flowery descriptions,

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metaphors, and paradoxes. The following sentence from «The Language of the Birds» is a wonderful example of the Turkish and Persian style:

His home is so beautiful that my tongue's pencil is insufficient to edit the few thoughts that I do manage to speak correctly. All right, since the bird's dream of what they have heard, let me say one or two words about the shah's characteristics. If I describe one thousandth of them, then evidently I was able to describe him from one till only a thousand, (emphasis mine)³

The first sentence is obviously a contradiction as rationally there is no need to edit something if it is done correctly, however, there is beauty for the mind that can see beyond what makes sense. However, none of them had their designated place for the meeting. There was no seating order and so a speckled crow sat in front of a parrot, and a bedraggled crow sat at a higher position than a nightingale and a dove. A vulture sat in the seat of honor instead of a falcon. A Carrion vulture snubbed a peacock and sat in front of it. Menial birds took the seats of adept ones. Birds with no crowns occupied the honored places and birds with crowns sat by the door.

The birds by the door began quarrelling, but the birds in honored places did not listen. Consequently, there was uproar. After quarrelling for a long time the birds began discussing the crisis. As time passed the crisis increased.

In his service you have u-come close to him-For his sake how many stopping places have you passed over? How many valleys have you flown over? You have made it to the final destination.

Just like Gabriel was beside Mustafo⁹ you have now been whew Solomon has been. You accompanied him in good and bad times. When he enjoyed life you were his dear advisor. If he wanted toknow how Bilqis¹⁰ was doing you would immediately set off to the city where she lived. You soothed his heart by in-

'In this way you were a help to the Prophet. You accompanied him while he waited for his difficulties to show another side. If he had a feast either in the city or in the desert, we would all use our wings to form a parasol for him. Hundreds of thousands of birds served as a tent for him and you resided with him in this shade "Thus at the feast he made you happy and aware of his secrets as a confidant.

Truth¹² assigned you a high position. Therefore, every feather and member of you obtained significance. Deception however hinders us. For this reason make us aware of this shah's secrets. Tell us the stories of his qualities and show us the right way to be of hi kind.

«You should save us from ignorance and banish naivety and lowliness. Tell us about his secrets and enjoy explaining it. Keep us from being consumed with anger and direct the search for our shah. If we reach our goal, we will be extremely grateful to you».

Hoopoe's Impressions after the Birds asked about Semurgh

With his breath, Hoopoe scattered sugar and sweet words were produced. After having seen the birds in distress he answered them in this way,

Let me tell you what I know about him and about his secrets that have entered my heart. However, to tell of the legend will not be enough. The people will not find his treasure with mere words. For what we want to do is a tremendous work. The shah and his palace are paramount, but the road is hard and the valleys long. Of course, you want me to speak about the shah but if 1 talked for a thousand years it would

No one can make sense of him, but his name must always be remembered. In order to do so one must first clean his mouth with the water of life ten times, maybe a hundred times, maybe limitless times. After having your tongue and mouth purified in this way, it is possible to cautiously mention his name.

However, the shah is above these things to a high degree. His home is so beautiful that my tongue's pencil is insufficient to edit the few thoughts that I do manage to speak correctly. All right, since the bird's dream of what they have heard, let me say one or two words about the shah's characteristics. If I describe one thousandth of them, then evidently I was

able to describe him from one till only a thousand. Our Shah is the shah of all shahs and he is always aware of our state. He is one, but he is also the ow-

ner of more than a thousand features. His features have spread all over the world and everything in the world has come from him. If he does not want anything to happen it will not happen. Nobody can even find a way to take a breath without his will. Whether you are great or low, or your stature and attributes are big or small, you are subject to him.

In each of his wings he has thousands of feathers and they fill a great space all around him. All of the feathers have the deep knowledge of the sea. It cannot be determined whether he is complex or simple. Your life is in his song and that's why you fly everywhere. Get to know him like the blood that is part of your body and as the soul that is alive in your body. He is dearer than the soul in your body; there is nothing closer than him.

However, you are a thousand years apart from him, as it should be. Perhaps it is good that you are tar from any possibility, for why should one have-a soul if he is a long way from it! If the soul is without him what use is it! Whomever the shah blesses with union, he will still appear attractive front two worlds away. To live in separation from him, however, is more perilous than death. It is worse than being in eight paradises and then falling through seven hells.

However, it is not easy to meet a shah like him. One cannot see him without enduring difficulties and great striving. Besides the thousand varieties of difficulties on the way, one needs genuine desire. The valley is extremely distant and on the way one can meet much misfortune. Hence, one should fly for a long way without stopping, yet the life of several Karkases'13 will not be enough to do this.

O divided Shaikh! The words of your speech are not one with your heart. People in love keep their secrets hidden, and are careful not to let them become exposed. Is it acceptable to share words like these hurriedly, especially before one's sweetheart? Do all people who fall in love do this? Is this an indication of the forbearance of the religious?'

O great dignitary,, the penalties consist of the following: without loathing you will I burn a fire around the church the duration of each night for exactly one year. During the day despite your weakness you will set off for the swineherds and there till evening you will fill the role of shepherd for those

After the year is finished, come to meet me. Then I will prepare the feast of enjoinment; I will come to you and begin the wedding in the fashion of unbelievers and I will make your heart happy.

If you are not ready to follow the regulations of love, don't continue this road. That is, if you do not

fulfill the penalties asstated, then quit unbelief, accept your religion, leave the church, and go back to Ka'ba. Yet how many days did you drink continuously? I had devoted myself to your drinking of wine. Reject your old clothes that were burnt and don't speak again about their quality.
